Process for Unsealing Adoption Records Information Provided by David Miller* St. Joseph's Orphanage Restorative Inquiry

- 1. Send two letter seeking "Non-Identifying Information" about your biological parents:
 - a. Letter One to the "Vermont Adoption Registry" of the Department of Children and Families (website: https://dcf.vermont.gov/vt-adoption-registry).
 - b. Letter Two to the private agency that handled the adoption (most likely Catholic Charities, the Lund Home, or some other agency).
- Request a Birth Certificate from the Vermont Vital Records of the Department of Health that has the <u>adopted parents</u> on the Certificate. (website: https://www.healthvermont.gov/health-statistics-vital-records/vital-records-population-data/birth)
- 3. Compose a letter to the appropriate** Probate Court as to the reason you are in need of unsealing the adoption records (<u>health issues are a good reason to seek the unsealing</u>). Include the Responses from the Vermont Adoption Registry and the private adoption agency along with a copy of the birth certificate.
- 4. Probate Court will schedule a hearing with the Probate Judge.

- ** Prior to composing your letter, contact your local Probate Court (there are 11 in Vermont) to see if you need to file your request locally or with Burlington Probate Court.
